Prefatory Comments

The aim of this document is to record in chronological order bibliographic information on every short story, novel, collection, non-fiction book, omnibus, and article by A.E. van Vogt and E. Mayne Hull. This includes:

- ◇ **Revisions** — Alterations of an existing work; everything from a simple change of a character's name up to a total re-write
- ◇ **Fix-ups** — The writing together of stories into a novel; sometimes the stories were written as a series and were already related; other stories have been revised thoroughly to fit in a new, larger story
- ◇ **Expansions** — Expanding off of a shorter work, usually turning a short story into a novel; often entails a degree of revision

◇ **Retitlements** — The change of a previously published work's title, whether it be a newly conceived title or a reversion to a previous one. Sometimes a publisher would change the title on the cover, but would not alter the plates for the actual text of the book — to do so was quite expensive. In these instances, the cover is considered the actual title.

◇ **Abridgements** — The omission of material contained in a previously published work; includes scenes cut from a novel, or stories excluded from a collection's reprint

◇ **Other alterations** — every kind of conceivable kind of alteration has been done to Van's corpus of work; this category includes alterations that are so specific and complicated that they cannot be easily summarized. For instance there are some books that have been retitled, then revised, then un-retitled. That sort of happening is so rare one would have to create a whole new category of alteration to accomodate it. Instead of allowing such things to drive me insane, I deal with each strange instance on an individual basis and lump them into the convenient category of "other alterations."

◇ **Significant Foregin Editions** — A surprising number of his works have only been published in languages other than English, primarily French. I also list all editions published first in a foreign language, even if it was subsequently published in English. I hope to have a Foreign Language counterpart of the Database on my site in the near future listing all foreign translation with publishing informtaion.

Introductions to books, interviews, letters to magazines, reviews, and articles about him have been excluded. I do however include articles written by Van; I list all the major ones, and plan to include more of the minor ones in a later update. Some material published in fanzines has been intentionally excluded. I include an anthology containing a van Vogt story only if it matches one of three criteria: (1) the anthology contains the first publication of a story; (2) the anthology contains a story not published in a collection; (3) the story in the anthology has a title other than the story's original title.

I have enumerated each work according to chronological order, with the suffixes *b*, *c*, *d*, and so on to indicate altered or retitled texts. The suffix *a* indicates the original version of a work, whether it be its first title or first version of a subsequently altered text. These numbers will undoubtedly be revised as I learn of additional works and new entries are inserted between existing ones.

The entries are arranged according to first English publication, or first publication of the work first appearing in a foreign language. Works which I have as yet been unable to pin down in which year they were published I tend to make a conjecture based on the information at hand.

The Database gives information on textual variants and retitlements, and notes on content, not merely editions by different publishers and different years; such

information can be found in Stephensen-Payne's bibliography (see below), or you can download a file I compiled called the [Van Vogt Compendium](#), which lists all English-language editions and printings, with additional indices by publisher and cover artist. So please note that by no means are all editions listed here in the Database; the function of the Database is purely bibliographic so I list only editions with differing contents, and usually first-book publication of serialized novels are mentioned. So, for instance, it should not be taken that all Paperback Library editions of *The Book of Ptath* are entitled *Two Hundred Million A.D.* as the 1964 and 1964 and 1966 editions are, even though only the 1964 and 1969 editions are listed.

I have recently been able to find information on his pre-1939 works, namely for confession magazines in the early 1930s and Canadian radio; they have been lumped together under the category of "1930s — Obscure Works." However, it should be noted that the titles and publishing information for most of these stories are not known and are sometimes guess work.

I apologize for the lack of hyperlinks; this document used to be thoroughly cross-indexed with them, but the alignment limitations of HTML code forced me to post this in PDF format. However, a benefit of this is that I don't have to post word processor documents in a variety of formats to accomodate different platforms and I can rest assured that the pages appears to all in the form that I intended. For quick cross-referencing, **I suggest you view this file with the Bookmark section of the Navigation Pane always showing.**

Feel free to print or distribute this file freely, so long as proper credit is given. I will update it as I learn more, correct, expand, and fiddle with it. I welcome any and all suggestions, comments, complaints, praises, corrections, and additions. If you are curious about the actual plot of a specific work, you may find it in the [Plot Summaries](#) section of my site. Only a few plot synopses are up at the moment, as it is a new section. However, I will steadily add more as time permits. I'd like nothing more than to sit around all day reading and summarizing his entire corpus of works, but unfortunately life tends to get in the way of things.

Sources

I had an interesting array of sources, some of which contradicted each other in a many number of ways. When my sources contradict each other I've decided on an individual basis which to go by. This decision can be based on my own knowledge of a book or story; or which source I determine to be more reliable on that point; or if my sources are the only place where I have information on an item and I do not have a copy of the item, I tend to go by the most commonly agreed upon information.

My primary bibliographic sources were not off the internet but were from a handful of excellent reference books. The five most notable and helpful reference books were, listed in order of descending usefulness:

However, even his own bibliography is far from complete, lacking entries on a few stories; whether these are omissions on his part or on the part of the publisher is unknown.

Format Key

* = Indicates that a work was written by Edna Mayne Hull, van Vogt's wife from May 9th, 1939 until her untimely death from cancer on January 20th, 1975. He later married Lydia Brayman on October 6th, 1979.

^ = Indicates that a work was written in collaboration; the other author is named in the main entry. When indicated with a collection, it means that book contains at least one story by another person or written with another person.

For this new version of the Database, I have put more emphasis on color-coding rather than alignment to differentiate the types of information given in each entry and to facilitate finding a specific kind of information for an entry when skimming the Database.

Color-Code Key:

Orange indicates notes by myself, regarding alterations or background information.

Blue:

In the case of a story, the blue titles indicates which collections it is included in.

In the case of novels, this color indicates publishing history. The blue titles are other editions, whether they be first book publication, magazine serialization, retitlements, revisions, expansions, abridgements, or the names of omnibuses they are included in.

Red are titles of stories and/or novels that a collection/omnibus contains.

Green are lists of series the item was a part of, with the other works given in order by publishing date. Information is also provided when story events take place out of the publishing order.

During the early 1930s van Vogt wrote for many of the "confession" magazines, because their contest prizes were alluring. The titles for only three stories are known. Despite the name "confession" these are fictitious works and were often written from the point of view of a woman. Since the number of these works is never likely to be known, they are enumerated separately from his post-July 1939 works.

In his 1975 autobiography *Reflections of A.E. van Vogt* he mentions a story published in the *Toronto Weekly Star* as an example of the publishers getting his name wrong in the byline — in this instance he was credited as "A. Ban Bogt." VV did not give the story's title or say when it was printed.

In November of 2002, George Gilbert recently searched through the *Toronto Star* archives and found the story in section 6 of the January 9th, 1937 issue. Running at 1,911 words and entitled "To Be His Keeper," it was

credited to "Alfred Alton Bogt." It's the story of a manipulative writer's reuniting with his estranged wife. Although it is a prime example of the slick, melodramatic "everyday life" genre, it nonetheless shows some typically van Vogtian elements. His early work adhered rigidly to the writing methods suggested by John Gallishaw, and this story is a fine example of that. It also shows a General Semantics influence, in that it shows the negative effects of people who are controlled by their emotions.

Van soon tired of confession stories and began writing SF after his interest in the genre was piqued by John W. Campbell's story "Who Goes There?" (under the pseudonym Don. A Stuart) in a 1938 issue of *Astounding*. Prior to that, he was put off by the crude writing of SF that he had read in other magazines. Soon, his sole output was science fiction stories.

Shortly after writing his first story, he and Edna Mayne Hull — also a Canadian — decided to marry, and were wed on May 9th, 1939.

In a letter dated June 12th, 1942 (included in the book *The John W. Campbell Letters with Isaac Asimov and A.E. van Vogt, Volume II*, 1993), Campbell is discussing with VV the future of space exploration — Campbell lays out the exact idea of a sleeper ship on its way to another planet being rendered obsolete during its centuries-long journey and the destination planet being colonized via faster-than-light colony ships in the meantime, a situation that shocks the sleeper ship's crew when they finally arrive. VV would use this idea, with minor modifications, in his 1944 story "Far Centaurus."

It's a well-known fact that Campbell supplied many ideas to Heinlein (such as the basis for "Beyond This Horizon") and Asimov (such as the *Foundation* series and the Three Laws of Robotics), but van Vogt was the odd man out — this is one of only two stories suggested by Campbell that VV took up and worked with that I know of (the other being "The Witch"). I think it speaks volumes for Campbell that he was more interested in ideas rather than who got credit for them — a sign of a truly great editor. It also speaks volumes for van Vogt, that he was able to work from his own ideas with such regularity.

This is the first and probably most famous of VV's "fix-up novels." "Fix-up" is a term coined by him to describe his practice of writing previously published stories into a larger connected narrative; basically re-writing old stories into an episodic novel. I like to break them into two main categories: *series fix-ups* are novels written from stories that feature the same characters, locations, and backgrounds and usually had a discernable progression of events from story to story. Series fix-ups often have very little linking material created to bridge the gaps. *Loose fix-ups* are novels written from stories that originally had no relation in their characters, locations, and backgrounds, have been re-written to feature at least one common character (often by means of simply changing the original character's name!) and often has a considerable amount of linking material, sometimes interwoven within the stories themselves. *Hybrid fix-ups* are a mix of the two types; some of the stories are from a series, but there are also stories thrown in that don't belong to that series, and VV writes them all together.

As he says in the preface: "In 1961, three universities — Columbia, UCLA, and UC Berkley — undertook to prepare a series of what were called oral histories of individuals in America whose life story might not normally be the subject of a published biography. [...] I was interviewed for twelve hours, and everything I said was recorded; my interviewer was Elizabeth Dixon of UCLA. Sometime later, I received a typed version of what I had said, and organizing it into a semblance of sense, I brought it up to date — by then it was 1964. The result was edited by Donald Schippers of the UCLA Oral History department, and four typewritten copies were made, one for each of three collaborating universities, and — of course — one for me, the author. I have now brought this material up to the present date of publication. First, I eliminated the excess verbiage so common to the conversational style; and, in addition, I removed a long discussion of Dianetics and the violent male. But I have tried to retain the original oral flavor."

In a later article, "My Life Was My Best Science Fiction Story" (1981), VV wrote a kind of continuation of this autobiography.

According to a 1979 interviewed conducted by Grant Thiessen (which can be read [elsewhere](#) on my website), VV hurriedly cobbled together *Supermind* in an afternoon in an attempt to pacify Wolheim, who was annoyed with him being literally years overdue to turn in the manuscript for *To Conquer Kiber*, a novel he contracted to write for DAW in 1975 (eventually published in French in 1985).

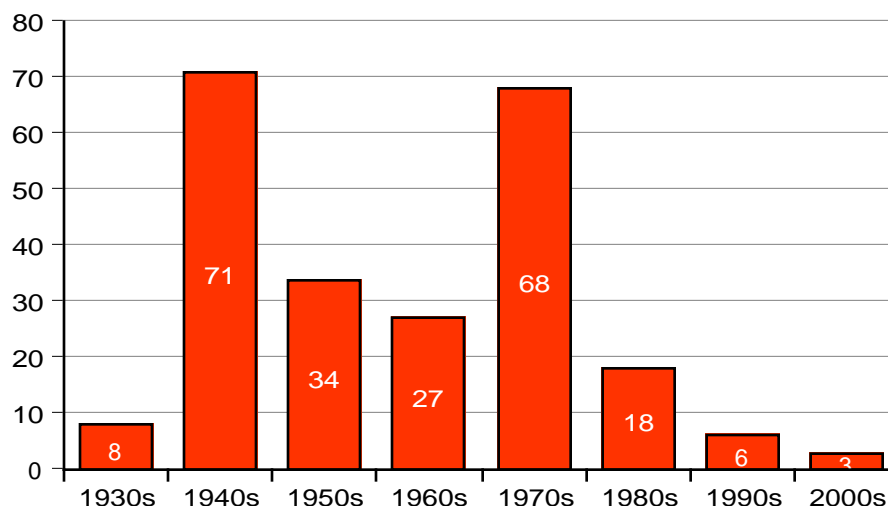
